Students at Harris Girls' Academy gain excellent grades in a wide range of academic and vocational subjects, including Maths, English and Triple/Double Science.

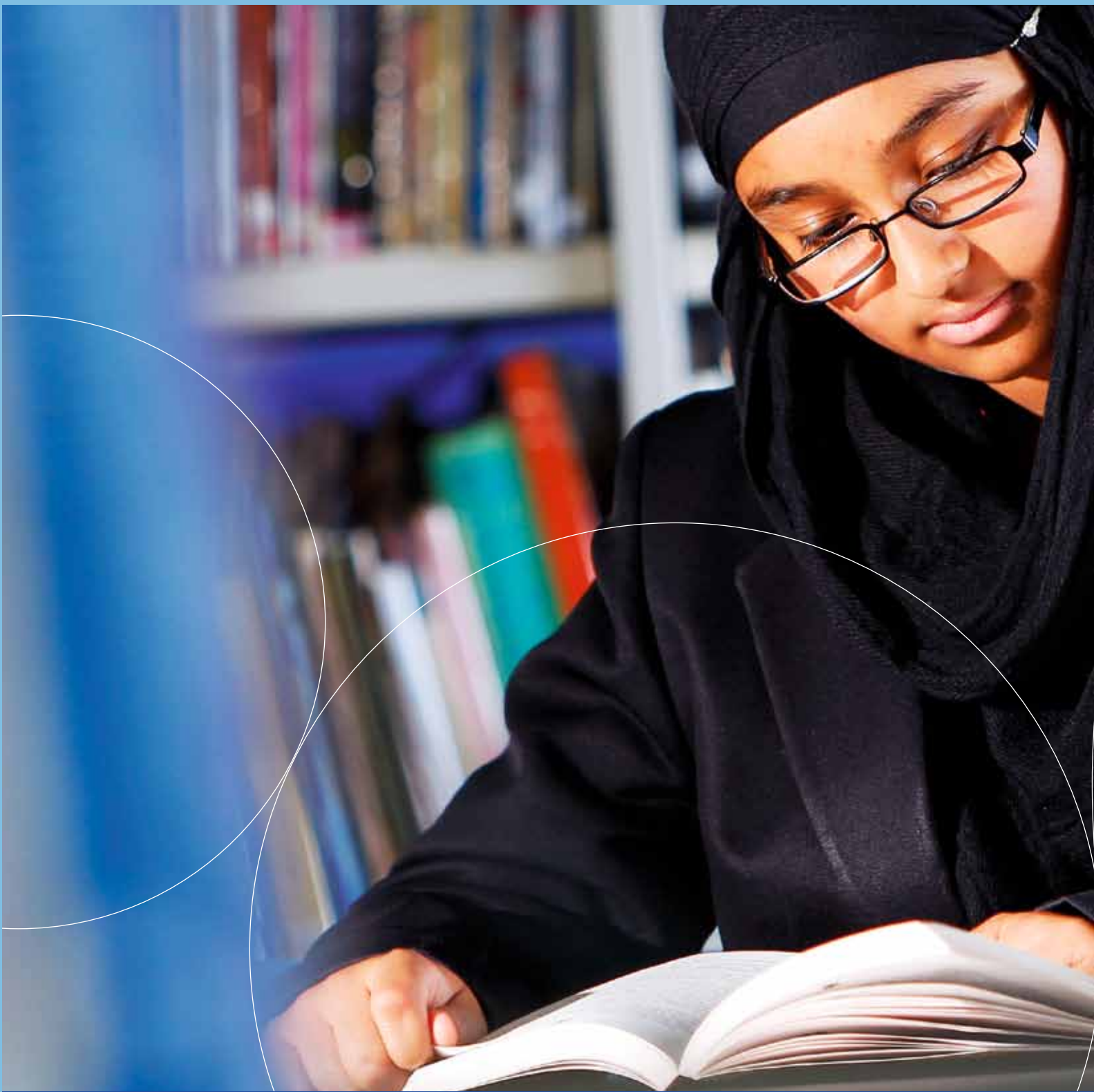

Working in Partnership



Partnership starts with our students, where our message is that "we're on the same side".

Student Commissioners work in a range of areas across the Academy from our Food Focus Group to our Illuminate Researchers who undertake student research in partnership with Goldsmith's University.

Students are expected to take responsibility for their own progress and lead the feedback to their parents about their progress and attainment.

Strong partnerships with external professionals offer students learning opportunities that connect with the workplace and promote the production of high quality artefacts.

Progression accords with King's College London offer our sixth formers a privileged route to access world class university education in a wide range of disciplines. Our close partnership with Harris Manchester Oxford provides our Future First scholarship students with unique access to experience of life as an Oxbridge student.





Promoting Citizenship

Student engagement in Academy life is a key principle and our social enterprise company, HOPE (Helping Others, Promoting Enterprise) allows students to manufacture at a high level and use their profits to help those in our community in greatest need.

Student work with charity includes partnership with the Evelina Children's Heart Organisation and supporting a people group in south-east Uganda.

At the heart of the Academy is a strong pastoral system focused around our three Houses – King's, Manchester and Oriel. Students spend time daily with their Learning Coach, focusing on our Harris Manners and the values we promote to encourage students

to become responsible citizens, both now and in the future. Students are supported in developing strong literacy, professional behaviour and opening up their horizons when thinking about their futures.

The Academy runs a series of assemblies and trips which reward positive behaviour and contribution and all students participate in the Vivo miles reward scheme.

Enriching Experiences

Here at Harris Girls' Academy East Dulwich we have a strong commitment to opening up horizons for our students, offering a breadth and depth of experience that will inspire, enthuse and develop our students.

Connect Radio is run by our students and broadcasts around the Academy and across South London.

Future First is our scholarship programme for students aiming to access Russell Group universities and offers exposure to a range of cultural and social experiences which broaden the experience of students and prepare them for the university application and interview process.

Our Academy specialisms bring many opportunities for students to enrich and broaden their experiences including:

- visits to King's College London's Science department
- work in our simulation suite
- partnership with Natwest to provide banking facilities
- exposure to a wide range of sporting expertise through Harris Fitness, including athletics with Herne Hill Harriers, ballet and gymnastics
- access to peer educators and mentors through our Health Hut provision
- visits, competition and the chance to start up student-led businesses through our Enterprise specialism

Many exciting trips take place each year including visits to the National Theatre, the L'Oreal Institute, the Royal Veterinary College, activity trips in Europe and sailing on the Isle of Wight.

The Harris Girls' Academy Gospel Choir is just one of a diverse range of clubs which runs regularly. Students perform at a range of events and occasions and, having spent time in professional recording studios, sell their tracks on itunes in support of our social enterprise company, HOPE.
