Enterprise

Across the Federation there will be opportunities for you to develop your entrepreneurial talents. There will be a variety of activities and events that will develop your knowledge, skills and attitude of what enterprise is all about. These will ensure you are aware and can develop the key skills such as team work, communication and presentation that employers and higher/further education institutions are looking for in their new recruits. The Harris Federation will have Enterprise as a special theme running across Post 16 study. Students will engage in special enterprise activities and events designed to build self confidence including participation in Young Enterprise, mini-Enterprise and many other activities.

Extra Curricular Activities

Studying hard is the main reason for taking Post 16 courses within the Federation, but we recognise that students make better progress if they can participate in, and benefit from, a wide range of extra curricular activities. Within the Federation we provide a much wider variety of activities for students to engage in, including the following:

Extended Programme

Through the extended programme students have the opportunity to gain extra qualifications in areas which complement their chosen courses. Students opt to complete additional studies in areas such as Philosophy, Further Maths, CISCO and the Extended Project. These all carry additional UCAS points and are an excellent way to add breadth to a student's CV.

Enrichment Courses for Personal Development

Across the Federation we have the scope to offer extensive enrichment activities which can range from sailing to participating in the debating society or learning conversational languages as an additional course. We create the opportunities for students to expand their CV and interests.



Work Experience

The Harris Federation has many links with business and industry. These are used to provide students with an opportunity to undertake work experience in an area related to their ultimate career interests. Students go through an application process and then negotiate a placement that fits in with their ambitions and timetable. Across the Harris Federation you will have plenty of opportunities to engage in active work with local business and industry. This will vary dependent on the nature of the courses that you choose to study. For example, those following vocational courses will have the opportunity to complete one day per week of work experience in a business that is directly linked to their courses. Also, during the enterprise activities you will have opportunities to work with businesses to solve real business problems. Our approach to work experience and work related learning ensures that you will have plenty of scope to think about your career plan and to discover more about the industries you are thinking of working in.

Responsibilities and Opportunities

Post 16 students are both role models for younger students and the public face of the Harris Federation within the local community.

Our students are aware of this and have worked with us to produce a number of codes of practice that give everyone the opportunity to distinguish themselves as Harris Federation Post 16 students in a positive and productive manner.

The Harris Post Sixteen dress code involves wearing professional style clothing

The Harris Federation's high expectations are reflected in its dress code. Students are expected to dress in a style that would be suitable in a professional environment. This enables students to be smart in appearance without having to conform to a uniform. The Harris dress code should not be expensive to buy.

Dress Code

- Jackets for male students are worn with collar and tie and shirt or blouse with collar and jacket for female students.
- Jewellery and make-up should be modest and sensible additions to dress.
- Colour schemes are at the discretion of individual students but it is expected that a sensible approach will be adopted.
- Jeans, leisure wear and trainers are not permitted.

Post 16 Study Base

Students have access to high quality supervised Post 16 study bases which are fully equipped with fast internet-linked computers and work spaces.

Prefects

Post 16 students are nominated each year to undertake the challenging role of Senior Prefects. They help to keep the Federation running smoothly by leading teams of students who undertake duties and responsibilities. These roles provide an excellent opportunity for personal development and confidence building and students add to their final references.

Staff and students vote at annual elections for a new Head Girl and Head Boy, who are experienced Senior Prefects, to represent the Federation and individual Academies at all official functions. They share in the management of the Post 16 areas and provide regular communication links between the Post 16 students, the Federation and Academy communities and outside agencies. They are ably assisted by the Deputy Head Boy and the Deputy Head Girl and other Senior Prefects. The Head Boy and Head Girl from each Academy act as Ambassadors for the Harris Federation at high profile events and form a Post 16 Federation student leadership team.





Careers

Academic Support, Careers Guidance and Mentoring

The Harris Federation places great emphasis on assisting students to plan for the future. With this in mind we offer a particularly strong ongoing programme of academic support and careers education and guidance.

All students receive Careers Education and Guidance as part of their Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE) programme delivered by their tutor.

Unlike other schools, the Harris Federation employs its own dedicated full-time Careers Consultants. This means that advice and guidance are immediately available when they are required.

In addition, academic tutors are responsible for small groups of students. The tutor monitors the progress of students and s/he is the first point of contact for advice and support on academic and other issues. Mentoring is provided on an individual basis. Regular parents' evenings and reports provide a stream of feedback and advice for parents and students.

A specialist programme of PSHE provides help with the preparation of university applications and CVs and the completion of job application forms.

The Harris Federation has many close links with a wide variety of universities and runs an Oxbridge entrants mentoring scheme. These are made full use of to the benefit of students in their progression to higher education.

Joining Post Sixteen within The Harris Federation

Making an Application

Courses on offer are shown on page 20 with further details of the course being found on our website: www.harrispost16.org.uk. Choose the courses that suit you best. Fill in the application form provided and then send in your application as soon as possible. Popular courses become oversubscribed very quickly so a prompt reply will prevent disappointment. Being a Federation means that Harris can offer a breadth of subjects most other Sixth Form institutions cannot. When making your application, you will be applying to the Harris Federation not to a specific Academy. The Academy you will attend will be discussed at your interview and will be dependent on where you live and the courses you wish to study. Some students may choose to attend two Academies to accommodate their course options. Minibuses (which are free of charge) transport students between the sites. Your base site will be confirmed in the summer once you have your GCSE results.

To apply

- If you are at a Croydon School you should apply through the Croydon Connexions application form available from your school.
- If you are at a school outside of Croydon, please fill in the form provided with the prospectus and return to the Harris Federation Post 16 Admissions Manager, Harris Academy Merton, Wide Way Mitcham CR4 1BP.

If you are applying from another school we will contact your present school and ask them for a reference. We will ask about your achievements, your attitude to study and your likely GCSE results. If the references are good we will invite you in for an interview and following that may make you an offer of a place on condition that you meet our entry requirements.

On receipt of your application we will assess your suitability for a place at the Harris Federation Post 16. You will be sent a date for an interview. These are taking place on Monday 25th January, Tuesday 8th February, Thursday 3rd March and Thursday 7th April 2011. We will notify you if we feel you would not benefit from continuing your studies within the Federation. The interview provides an opportunity for us to find out more about you and your plans and enables you to make an informed decision about studying with us. You will be told about the entry qualifications required for the course of study you wish to pursue. After your interview we will write to you informing you of the outcome. If you are not sure which course to apply for but know that you want to study with us, then telephone the Harris Federation Post 16 Admissions Manager, Ms Burgess at Harris Academy Merton on: 020 8623 1004 or email us at: info@harrispost16.org.uk.

The deadline for applications for September 2011 is Friday 11th March 2011. Applications received after this date will be placed on a waiting list.

Studying within the Harris Federation

To ensure that every student maintains a good standard of work throughout his or her time at the Federation we provide a number of support activities.

Supported Private Study

This is supervised in the Study Bases where students are expected to work quietly. These sessions help students to organise themselves and make space for social activities at other times.

Monitoring and Target Setting

Each student is set a series of personalised target grades based on their past academic performance. Achievement against these targets is compared to actual performance on a regular basis. Where current achievement is below the target, a series of study strategies are agreed to close the gap. This process ensures that students are focused throughout their course, that they remain well motivated and retain a sense of realism about their academic performance and possible career options.

The Tutoring System

Every Post 16 student will be part of a tutor group with an assigned tutor who has responsibility for overseeing students' progress. Deciding on academic targets, discussing progress and working on applications to university or college are undertaken in conjunction with the tutor. In addition, there is a Post 16 Co-ordinator who has overall responsibility for the welfare of students and a Deputy Co-ordinator whose main responsibility is the academic progress of students.

Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE)

In Post 16 PSHE, students concentrate on issues of direct relevance to their work and future. Time is spent on developing study skills, in working on careers guidance and in preparing students for the move into higher education or into employment.

Financial Assistance and Education Maintenance Allowance

There is a full range of travel and other grants available to students who are eligible for them. Full details can be obtained from our Finance Office which is open every day during term time. Students whose parental income falls within certain boundaries are entitled to a weekly Education Maintenance Allowance. Full details will be available during enrolment.



Types of Study Programme

A broad range of courses are available with something for every student.

GCE A/AS Level

In order to study GCE A Level courses you will need a minimum of five GCSE passes at A* to C, with a minimum B grade or above in relevant subjects. GCE A levels are two year courses, many of which are modular. The Advanced Subsidiary (AS) course is the first half of a full GCE A Level and is made up of two or three teaching units. These continue into Year 13 as A2 courses to make full GCE A level qualifications.

International Baccalaureate

In order to study for this qualification, you will need a minimum of 7 A*– B grades at GCSE including a B grade or above in a related subject for the subjects to be studied at the Higher Level.

BTEC Level 3 Diploma

In order to study BTEC Level 3 Subsidiary Diploma and Diploma courses, four GCSE passes at A* to C are required. These are two year full time courses, comprising twelve units. BTEC Level 3 Diploma courses are equivalent to 1, 2 or 3 'A' Levels depending on the size of course taken.

BTEC Level 2 Extended Certificates

In order to study BTEC Level 2 Extended Certificates or Diplomas, five GCSE passes of A to E with at least 3 at D grade are required.

BTEC Level 1 Certificates and Awards

In order to study BTEC Level 1 Certificate and Award courses, 3 D to G grades at GCSE are required with evidence of a good attendance record.

Re-sit courses in English and Mathematics GCSE

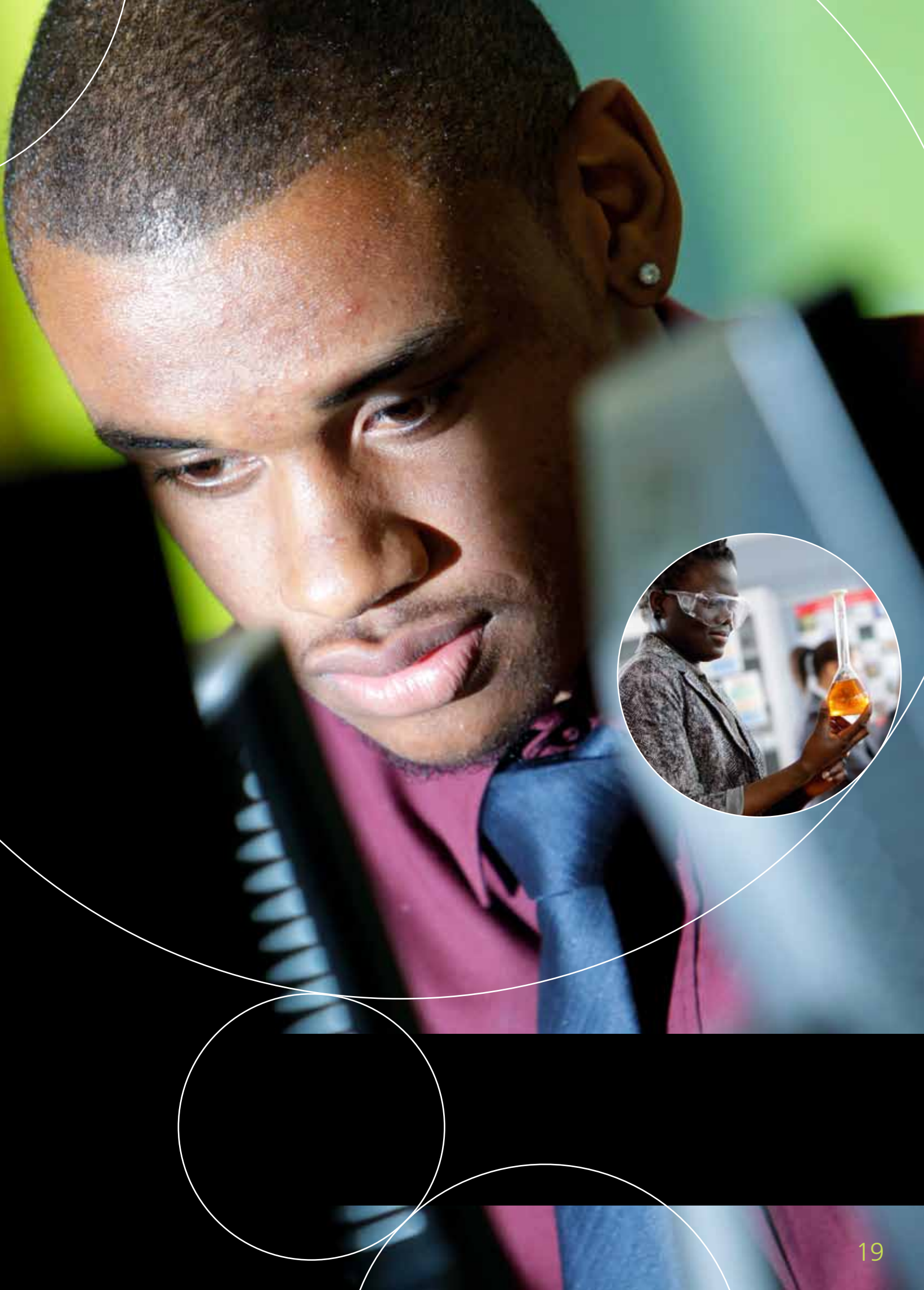
Re-sit courses in English and Maths are available for those who need to take them. Students taking re-sits should ideally have obtained a D grade.

Induction Period

Students should enrol for their courses on the published date. There are several elements that make up our induction procedures. There are opportunities to attend taster lessons in the Summer Term, summer homework to be completed before your courses start in September and induction activities in the first week where you can meet other students and key staff. There are also subject based induction programmes. This means all students have a thorough introduction to life at the Harris Federation Post 16 and can embark on their courses with confidence.

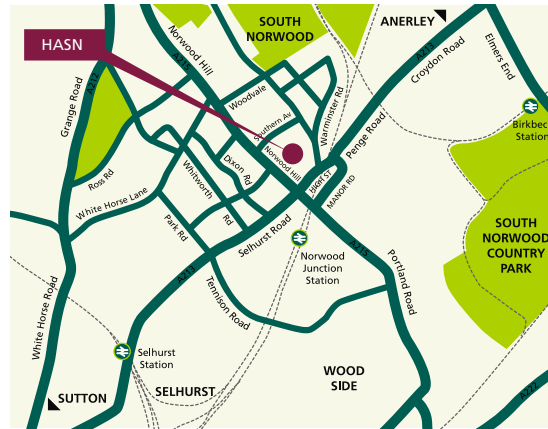

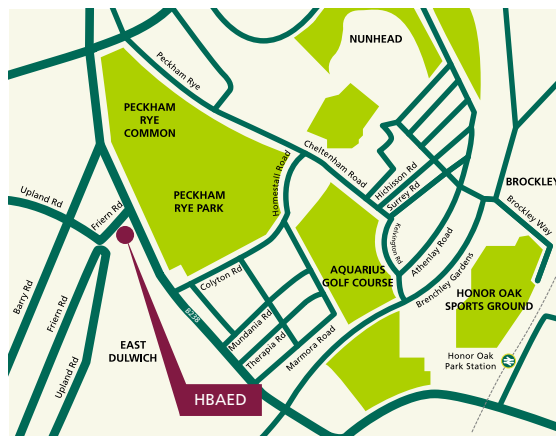

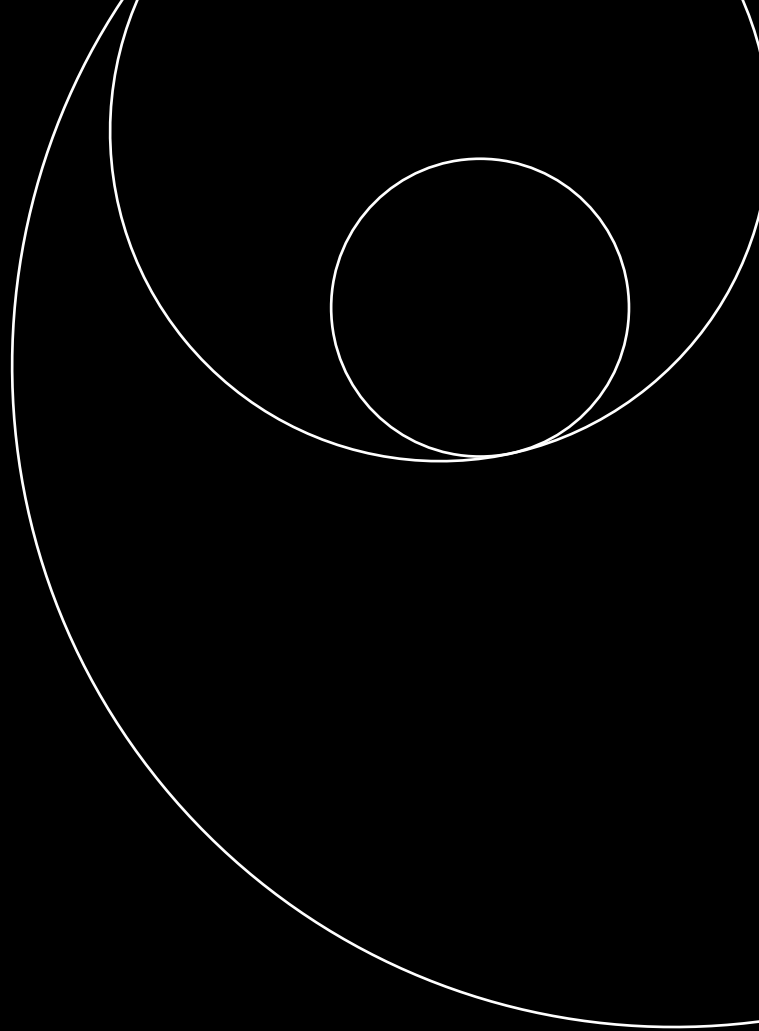
